



My name is Wayne M. Gomes, I serve as Public Relations / Financial Coordinator for the United States Aviation Museum, B-29 Restoration Project. Our museum's Boeing B-29 Superfortress "DOC", 44-69972 is currently being restored to flying status by the Boeing Company in Wichita Kansas, it is the last known B-29 considered to be air worthy.

"DOC" is about 70% complete, and it is hoped that in late 2004, or early 2005 we will be able to roll "DOC" out for the entire world to see. The restoration project can be viewed by visiting the Boeing Company web site <http://b-29.boeing.com>.

Unfortunately there are many veterans that know little or nothing about this restoration, and some believe that "DOC" is just for static display. Some of the work is being conducted in the same hangar where "DOC" was originally assembled in nearly 60 years ago.
